



# 2009 CPN Showcase

Recognising and sharing initiatives in corruption prevention

## Corruption Prevention Network

The Corruption Prevention Network (CPN) Showcase recognises and encourages innovation and good practice in corruption prevention. The CPN Showcase promotes efforts made by Australian organisations to develop or adapt corruption prevention strategies to manage their corruption risks.

### Who can nominate?

The CPN Showcase is open to all organisations in Australia (including public and private business enterprises, not for profit organisations and state, local and commonwealth government agencies) if the following requirements can be met:

- Your entry is endorsed by the CEO of your organisation.
- Your entry is submitted using the nomination form provided by the due date.
- Your organisation is not represented on the CPN Showcase selection panel.

Previously unsuccessful applicants are welcome to resubmit. Previous award winners are also welcome to resubmit if there are substantial changes to their previous submissions. There is no fee to enter.

### What initiatives may be nominated?

One or many specific tools, techniques or programs relating to any area of corruption prevention can be nominated for the CPN Showcase. The tool, technique or program must have been tried and tested within the organisation. Strategies that are still in the design or draft phase should not be nominated until after they have been implemented and some assessment has been made concerning their usefulness.

### Recognition of initiatives

A brief description of all nominee initiatives will be given at the 2009 CPN conference to promote and share these initiatives. All nominees will be presented with a *Certificate of Recognition* for their contribution to the CPN Showcase. In addition, one nominee will be selected by the CPN Showcase Committee and presented with the *CPN Showcase Award* in recognition of innovation in corruption prevention. The *CPN Showcase Award* will include one free registration to the CPN conference to be held in Sydney on 9 September 2009.

All certificates and awards will be presented at the 2009 CPN conference. Nominees must be present at the conference to collect the certificate or award and must meet all associated costs.

All nomination forms will be used only by CPN for the purpose of the 2009 CPN Showcase and will be destroyed after the 2009 CPN conference or returned on request.
